Public School Teacher invites students to Same-Sex "Wedding"

A New York seventh-grade teacher has invited his class to attend the commitment ceremony of him and his same-sex partner. Without consulting the student's parents, teacher Chance Nalley, jotted down the invite and passed them out to his students in class, reported Susan Dominus of the New York Times.

Mr. Nalley told Ms. Dominus, "They kept asking if they were invited," he said of his students at Columbia, a selective public school that specializes in math, science and engineering. "Originally, I said no. But when I found a venue that turned out to be big enough I said, 'O.K., you can come.' I invited their parents, too."

One of his students asked whether same-sex marriage is legal and Mr. Nalley admitted that it was not. When parents complained to the principal and requested that their children be removed from his class, they were told that if they wanted their children to take math, Mr. Nalley was their only choice.
